Pregnant and using? Answering common questions...

I am taking medication that my doctor prescribed

- Inform your OBGYN of your prescribed medications
- Sign a release so your OBGYN and doctor can coordinate care
- Create a Plan of Safe Care to get connected to resources
- Bring prescriptions to the hospital at time of delivery
- After delivery, Children Services is notified to validate the prescription and Plan of Safe Care

I am taking illegal drugs

Taking illegal drugs while pregnant can have a disastrous impact on your health and your baby's health; it can cause miscarriages, low birth weight, premature labor, placental abruption, fetal death, and even maternal death.



- Talk with your OBGYN or primary care physician about your drug use
- Participate in treatment programs or support services
- Create a Plan of Safe Care listing all the support you have in place
- If you or your baby tests positive for substances at time of delivery, a report will be made to Children Services

Why is Children Services notified?

In Ohio, hospitals are required to report to Children Services if:

- mom or baby tests positive for substances,
- the baby has signs of withdrawal,
- there are indications of abuse,
- or mom has a history of substance abuse.

Before you leave the hospital, a social worker, Early Intervention specialist or Children Services staff will visit with you. If a Plan of Safe Care is not in place, your baby may not be able to go home with you.
